3,276 meals served and/or provided to Sonoyta shelters





15 medical appointments provided

*You may notice our numbers for meals served/funded and medical appointments provided are much lower for the month of June compared to the month of May.*

*This is due to the fact that Casa del San Pedro has not hosted migrant families in over one month. Additionally, over 100 migrants previously seeking assistance in Sonoyta are now either in Nogales or in the United States furthering their asylum cases.*

By the time we are typing this we are currently providing services for 140 newcomers and we are currently working to solve the challenges that the summer brings, our need for ways to keep migrants cool while they're with us is bumping our electric bill a bit too high, but we are confident that with all of your support we'll make it through. We're gonna keep working hard to keep visiting migrant families safe and taken care of, thanks to everybody that makes this possible, greetings from Sonoyta"
